


Outcomes:


Chart showing number of sessions delivered by Hub Officers in the community and player pathway YTD


Chart showing number of sessions delivered by Hub Officers in the community and player pathway T2


Chart showing number of sessions delivered by Hub Officers in the community and player pathway T1

Chart showing number of players transferred from hub establishments into the community







Chart showing number of opportunities provided by Hub Officers in the establishments and across primary schools T2



Chart showing number of opportunities provided by Hub Officers in the establishments and across primary schools T1



Chart showing delivery from Hub Officer in specific SEN/ALN Establishments




Chart showing involvement from Hub Officer and volunteers provided by the hub officer to FFF camps and Inclusion Events
